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AmericanHort Alex Laurie Award Winners Announced

Columbus, Ohio – Robin Brumfield, Rutgers University, Andrew Koeser, University of Florida; Sarah Lovell, University of Illinois; Aaron Petri, University of Illinois, and Ryan Stewart, Brigham Young University were named recipients of the AmericanHort Alex Laurie Award during Cultivate'15.

The Alex Laurie Award is presented by AmericanHort to the author(s) of the most significant applied floriculture research paper published in any of the three refereed American Society for Horticultural Science publications during a calendar year.

The award was presented for “Biocontainer Use in a *Petunia xhybrida* Greenhouse Production System: A Cradle-to-Gate Carbon Footprint Assessment of Secondary Impacts” published during 2014 in the *HortScience* journal.

Each researcher receives an honorarium, a plaque, and an opportunity to participate in the Cultivate'16 program.

This award was established in honor of the late Alex Laurie (1892-1982), renowned floriculture teacher and researcher at The Ohio State University and founder of the Ohio Florists' Association (now AmericanHort).
